

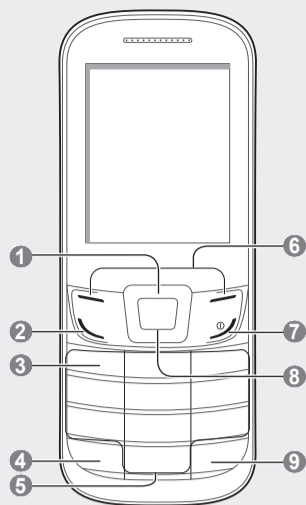

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## Device layout



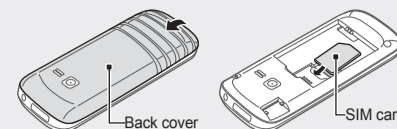
- Navigation key**  
From the Home Screen, access user-defined menus; In Menu screen, scroll through menu options  
*Pre-defined menus might differ, depending on your service provider*
- Dial Key**  
Make or answer a call; From the Home Screen, retrieve recently dialled, missed, or received numbers
- Voicemail key**  
From the Home Screen, access voice mails (press and hold)
- Keypad lock key**  
From the Home Screen, lock or unlock the keypad (press and hold)
- Alphanumeric keys**
- Softkeys**  
Perform actions indicated at the bottom of the display
- Power key**  
Turn the device on or off (press and hold); End a call; In Menu mode, cancel an input and return to the Home Screen
- Confirm key**  
From the Home Screen, access Menu screen; In Menu screen, select the highlighted menu option, or confirm an input  
*The key might perform differently, depending on your region*
- Silent mode key**  
From the Home Screen, activate or deactivate the silent mode (press and hold)

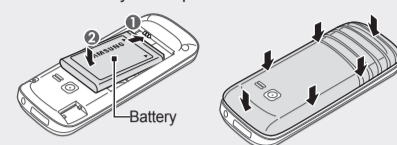
## Installing the SIM card and battery

- Remove the back cover and insert the SIM card.



- Do not bend or twist the back cover excessively. Doing so may damage the cover.

- Insert the battery and replace the back cover.



## Charging the battery



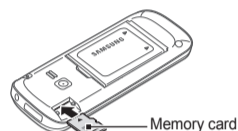
- Plug a charger into the multipurpose jack.
- Unplug the charger when charging is complete.

- Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorised chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.
- Do not remove the battery from the device before unplugging the charger to prevent damage.

- To save energy, unplug the charger when not in use. The charger does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the charger from the outlet when not in use to avoid wasting power. The charger should remain close to the electrical socket while charging.

## Installing a memory card

Your device accepts memory cards with maximum capacities of 16 GB. Depending on the memory card manufacturer and type, some memory cards may not be compatible with your device.



Insert the memory card as shown in the drawing.

- Formatting the memory card on a PC might cause incompatibility with your device. Format the memory card only on the device.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- Do not use sharp tools to remove the memory card from the device.

## Turning your device on or off

## Turn your device on

Press and hold the Power key, then enter your PIN and press &lt;Confirm&gt;, if necessary.

## Turn your device off

Press and hold the Power key.

- If the battery is fully discharged or removed from the device, the time and date will be reset.

## Accessing menus

To access your device's menus or options,

Navigation key	Scroll to each menu.
Confirm key	Launch a menu or an application.
<Menu>	Open the Menu screen.
<Back>	Return to previous screen.
	Close menu or application and return to the Home Screen.

- When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied by the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

## Entering text

## Change the text input mode

Press [#]	Change to uppercase, lowercase, or switch to Number mode.
Press and hold [#]	Switch between T9 and ABC mode. Depending on your region, you might be able to use an input mode for your specific language.
Press [*]	Switch to Symbol mode.
Press and hold [*]	Select an input mode or change input language.

## T9 mode

- Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word.
- When the word displays correctly, press [0] to insert a space. If the word does not display, press the Navigation key up or down to select an alternate word.

## ABC mode

Press an appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.

## Number mode

Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.

## Symbol mode

Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a symbol.

## Other features for text input

Navigation key	Move the cursor.
Press <Clear>	Delete characters one by one.
Press and hold <Clear>	Delete characters quickly.
Press [0]	Insert a space.
Press [1]	Enter punctuation marks.

## Making or answering a call

- To make a call, enter a phone number and press [Call].
- To end a call, press [End].
- To call a recently dialled number, press [Redial] to select a number, and press [Redial] again to dial the number.
- To make a call using the phonebook, press <Menu> → Phonebook, select a contact and press [Call].
- To answer an incoming call, press [Call].

## Sending and viewing messages

&lt;Menu&gt; → Messages

## Send a message

- Press **Create message**.
- Press **Add** to open the phonebook.
- Select a contact and press **Add**. Or, enter a contact number.
- Scroll down and enter a text message. See "Enter text".
- To attach files with the message, press <Options> → **Add multimedia** and select files.
- Press **Send**.

## View a message

Press **Inbox** and select a message to read.

## Managing your contacts

Save your data such as names, phone numbers and personal information in the device memory, SIM card, or the memory card.

&lt;Menu&gt; → Phonebook

## Add a new contact

- Press the confirm key to **Create contact**
- Select a number type (if necessary)
- Enter contact information and press the Confirm key.

## Edit a contact

- Select a contact and press the Confirm key.
- Edit items and press the Confirm key to save.

## Delete a contact

Select a contact and press <Options> → **Delete contact**.

- You can change the memory location by pressing <Menu> → Phonebook → <Options> → **Settings** → **Save new contacts to** and selecting a memory location.

## Using the camera

&lt;Menu&gt; → Camera

## Take a photo

- Rotate the device anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments by pressing <Options>.
- Press the Confirm key to take a photo. Photos are saved automatically.

## Record a video

- Press <Options> and select **Camcorder**. Or, press [1] to change from **Camera to Camcorder**.
- Rotate the device anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments by pressing <Options>.
- Press the Confirm key to start recording.
- Press the Confirm key to end recording. Videos are saved automatically.

## View photos and videos

From the Home Screen, press <Menu> → **My files** → **Images** or **Videos** and select an item to view.

## Listening to music

Keys	Function
Confirm key	Play, pause, or resume a music.
Navigation key	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Left: Skip backward (press); Scan backward in a file (press and hold).</li> <li>Right: Skip forward (press); Scan forward in a file (press and hold).</li> <li>Up/Down: Adjust the volume.</li> </ul>
2	Select the sound effect.
3	Turn shuffle mode on or off.
4	Change the repeat mode.
5	Change the music display.

## Browsing the web

&lt;Menu&gt; → Internet

- When you access **Internet** for the first time, you might be prompt to create an Internet profile.

## Navigate web pages

Keys	Function
Navigation key	Scroll up or down on a web page.
Confirm key	Select an item.
<Back>	Return to the previous page.
<Options>	Open browser options.

## Bookmark your favourite web page

- Press <Options> → **Bookmarks** → <Options> → **Add bookmark**.
- Enter details and press the Confirm key.

## Using the alarm

&lt;Menu&gt; → Organiser → Alarms

## Set a new alarm

- Press <Create>.
- Enter details and press <Save>.

## Stop an alarm

- When an alarm rings,
  - Press <Confirm> to stop the alarm.
  - Press <Snooze> to silence the alarm for the snooze period.

## Deactivate an alarm

Select an item and press <Options> → **Deactivate alarm**.

## Listening to the FM radio

&lt;Menu&gt; → Applications → FM radio

## Activate the FM radio

- Plug a headset into the device.
- Press the Confirm key to turn on the FM radio.
- Press <Yes> to start automatic tuning. You will be asked to start automatic tuning when accessing the FM radio for the first time.
- Control the FM radio using the following keys:

Keys	Function
Confirm key	Turn the FM radio on or off.
Navigation key	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Left/Right: Fine-tune the frequency; Search for the next available station (press and hold).</li> <li>Up/Down: Adjust the volume.</li> </ul>

## Add a radio station to the favourites list

- Plug a headset into the device.
- Press <Options> → **Add to Favourites**.
- Assign a key and press <Select>.

## Using the Bluetooth feature

&lt;Menu&gt; → Applications → Bluetooth

## Turn on the Bluetooth feature

- Press <Options> → **Settings** and set **Bluetooth to On**.
- Set **My phone's visibility** to allow other devices to search your device.

## Find and pair with other Bluetooth devices

- Press the confirm key to find other Bluetooth devices.
- Select a device and press the Confirm key.
- Enter the PIN code, and press <OK> to match the PIN between the devices (if necessary).
- When the other device accepts the connection, pairing is complete.

- You might have to enter a PIN, depending on the device.

## Turn off the Bluetooth feature

Select <Options> → **Settings** and set **Bluetooth to Off**.

## Send data using the Bluetooth feature

- Select items to send from one of your device's applications.
- Press <Options> → **Send via** → **Bluetooth**.

## Customising your device

Settings control how applications and functions operate. Change them to customise the device. Appearances, sound profiles, call actions and many more can be customised.

Menu	Description
<b>Sound profiles</b>	Change alert type, ringtone, volume, etc.
<b>Display</b>	Alter wallpaper, theme, font, brightness, etc.
<b>Time and date</b>	Change time and date of the device.
<b>Phone</b>	Change device language, etc.
<b>Call</b>	Set auto reject, answering mode, call forwarding, fake call, etc.
<b>Backup manager</b>	Back up or restore your data.
<b>Security</b>	Set locks or change passwords.
<b>PC connections</b>	Set connection settings with a PC.
<b>Network</b>	Change network profiles settings.
<b>Memory</b>	Clear memory, manage the memory card, or set default memory location.
<b>Reset all</b>	Reset the device.

## Adjusting the sound profiles

&lt;Menu&gt; → Settings → Sound profiles

## Change the ringtone

- Select a profile and press <Edit>.
- Press **Voice call ringtone**.
- Choose a ringtone and press the Confirm key.

## Change the message alert tone

- Select a profile and press <Edit>.
- Press **Message alert tone**.
- Choose a tone and press the Confirm key.

## Adjust the volume of the ringtone

- Select a profile and press <Edit>.
- Press **Volume** → **Call alert**.
- Adjust the volume and press <Save>.

## Adjust the volume of voice during a call

While a call is in progress, press the Navigation key up or down to adjust the volume.

- To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

## Customising the Home Screen

Customise your Home Screen with your favourite applications, contacts, calendar, and many more.

- The shortcuts assigned to the Navigation key is disabled when you are using the smart idle on your Home Screen.

<Menu> → Settings → Display → **Smart home** → **Smart idle**

## Add items to the smart idle

- Press <Edit> and select items to display on the Home Screen.
- Press <Options> → **Save** → <Set>.

## Customize the shortcuts toolbar

- Press <Edit> → **Shortcuts toolbar** → <Options> → **Edit shortcuts** → <Edit>.
- Select items to add to the shortcuts toolbar and press <Save>. New items can be added to empty spaces.

## Use the smart home

Select an item on the smart home and press the Confirm key to launch the item.

- Press <Menu> → Settings → Display → **Smart home** to change the Home Screen to another style.

## Backing up your data

Back up your data, such as contacts, messages, calendar, and tasks to your memory card. To use this feature, a memory card must be installed.

<Menu> → Settings → Backup manager

### Back up your data

Press **Backup**, select items to back up and press <Backup>.

### Restore your data

Press **Restore**, select items to restore and press <Restore>.

## Using shortcuts

<Menu> → Settings → Phone → Shortcuts

### Edit shortcuts

1. Select a Navigation key and press <Change>.
2. Select an application to assign and press <Save>.

## Using the mobile tracker

The mobile tracker feature helps locate and recover your device if its stolen or lost. When someone inserts a different SIM card, a tracking message will be sent to preset recipients. This feature might be unavailable due to certain features supported by your service provider.

<Menu> → Settings → Security → Mobile tracker

You might have to confirm your password when accessing the mobile tracker.

### Activate the mobile tracker

1. Enter password and press <OK>.
2. Press <Change> to select **On**.
3. Enter recipients and sender details.
4. Press **Save** → <Accept>.

### Deactivate the mobile tracker

1. Enter password and press <OK>.
2. Press <Change> to select **Off**.

## Using the SOS message feature

Send an SOS message to your family or friends in an emergency.

<Menu> → Messages → Settings → SOS messages

### Activate the SOS message feature

1. Press **Sending options** → <Change> and set **Sending SOS** to **On**.
2. Enter recipient and press the Confirm key.
3. Set the number of times to repeat the message.
4. Edit SOS message (if necessary).
5. Press <Back> → <Yes>.

### Send an SOS message

1. With the keypad locked, press [ ] four times to send an SOS message to preset numbers.
2. To exit SOS mode, press [ ].

## Making fake calls

<Menu> → Settings → Call → Fake call

### Activate the fake call feature

1. Set **Fake call hot key** to **On**.
2. Change caller name or number (if necessary).

### Make a fake call

Press and hold the Navigation key down.

Do not use your device near other electronic devices

Most electronic devices use radio frequency signals. Your device may interfere with other electronic devices.

Do not use your device near a pacemaker

- Avoid using your device within a 15 cm range of a pacemaker, if possible, as your device can interfere with the pacemaker.
- To minimise possible interference with a pacemaker, use your device only on the side of your body that is opposite the pacemaker.

- Call roadside assistance or a special, non-emergency assistance number when necessary. If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle that you know to be stolen, call a number that is designated for reporting these types of situations.

## Proper care and use of your mobile device

### Keep your device dry

- Humidity and liquids may damage the parts or electronic circuits in your device.
- Do not turn on your device if it is wet. If your device is already on, turn it off and remove the battery immediately (if the device will not turn off or you cannot remove the battery, leave it as-is). Then, dry the device with a towel and take it to a service centre.
- Liquids will change the colour of the label that indicates water damage inside the device. Water damage to your device can void your manufacturer's warranty.

### Do not use or store your device in areas with high concentrations of dust or airborne materials

Dust or foreign materials can cause your device to malfunction and may result in fire or electric shock.

### Store your device only on flat surfaces

If your device falls, it may be damaged.

### Do not store your device in very hot or very cold areas. It is recommended to use your device at temperatures from 5 °C to 35 °C

- Your device can explode if left inside a closed vehicle, as the internal temperature can reach up to 80 °C.
- Do not expose your device to direct sunlight for extended periods of time (on the dashboard of a car, for example).
- Store the battery at temperatures from 0 °C to 45 °C.

### Do not store your device with metal objects, such as coins, keys, and necklaces

- Your device may be scratched or may malfunction.
- If the battery terminals come into contact with metal objects, this may cause a fire.

### Do not store your device near magnetic fields

- Your device may malfunction or the battery may discharge from exposure to magnetic fields.
- Magnetic stripe cards, including credit cards, phone cards, passbooks, and boarding passes, may be damaged by magnetic fields.

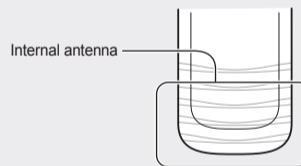
- Doing so may damage the device or cause explosion.
- If children use the device, make sure that they use the device properly.

### Do not insert the device or supplied accessories into the eyes, ears, or mouth

Doing so may cause suffocation or serious injuries.

### When using the device:

- Hold the device upright, as you would with a traditional phone.
- Speak directly into the microphone.
- Do not touch the device's internal antenna. Doing so may result in reduced call quality or cause the device to emit unintended levels of radio frequency (RF) energy.



### Protect your hearing and ears when using a headset

- Excessive exposure to loud sounds can cause hearing damage.
- Exposure to loud sounds while driving may distract your attention and cause an accident.
- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

## Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

### THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields) recommended by international guidelines. The guidelines were developed by an independent scientific organisation (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The radio wave exposure guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2.0 W/kg.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The highest SAR values under the ICNIRP guidelines for this device model are:

### Maximum SAR for this model and conditions under which it was recorded

Head SAR	0.822 W/kg
Body-worn SAR	0.546 W/kg

During use, the actual SAR values for this device are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimise interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output of the device, the lower its SAR value.

A body-worn SAR test has been performed on this device at a separation distance of 1.5 cm. To meet RF exposure guidelines during body-worn operation, the device must be positioned at least 1.5 cm away from the body.

Organisations such as the World Health Organisation and the US Food and Drug Administration have suggested that if people are concerned and want to reduce their exposure, they could use a hands-free accessory to keep the wireless device away from the head and body during use, or reduce the amount of time spent using the device.
